Scripture Reading (*The Message* translation)

Galatians 1:6-9: 5:1.22-25

I can't believe your fickleness - how easily you have turned traitor to him who called you by the grace of Christ by embracing a variant message! ⁷ It is not a minor variation, you know; it is completely other, an alien message, a nomessage, a lie about God. Those who are provoking this agitation among you are turning the Message of Christ on its head. ⁸ Let me be blunt: If one of useven if an angel from heaven! - were to preach something other than what we preached originally, let him be cursed. ⁹ I said it once; I'll say it again: If anyone, regardless of reputation or credentials, preaches something other than what you received originally, let him be cursed.

Christ has set us free to live a free life. So take your stand! Never again let anyone put a harness of slavery on you.... But what happens when we live God's way? He brings gifts into our lives, much the same way that fruit appears in an orchard - things like affection for others, exuberance about life, serenity. We develop a willingness to stick with things, a sense of compassion in the heart, and a conviction that a basic holiness permeates things and people. We find ourselves involved in loyal commitments, ²³ not needing to force our way in life, able to marshal and direct our energies wisely. Legalism is helpless in bringing this about; it only gets in the way. ²⁴ Among those who belong to Christ, everything connected with getting our own way and mindlessly responding to what everyone else calls necessities is killed off for good - crucified. ²⁵ Since this is the kind of life we have chosen, the life of the Spirit, let us make sure that we do not just hold it as an idea in our heads or a sentiment in our hearts, but work out its implications in every detail of our lives.

Hear what God's Spirit is saying to us. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God!**
